Tribal Nations and in particular, Gaming, Casino's, and Resorts are the target of cyberhackers, nation states and ransomware. Why have they been targeting Tribal Casino's? Because they are a complex network environment, with few cybersecurity controls, they are typically not protected by highly skilled, cybersecurity professionals, and they deal in lots of electronic money. Banks are no longer the targets, they have too much money and people to help them protect themselves. Now the bad guys have shifted their focus to easier and more "target rich" environments. We will discuss the complexities of the typical Tribal Casino and Resort operations, where the attackers target and why, then we'll give you real actions you can take NOW to start protecting your operations.

- **4:00 pm Security Operation Centers Explained – What it IS and What it ISN'T**

So many tribal entities are moving toward a SOC in the cloud to establish 24 x 7 monitoring that is needed to protect tribal assets. Untangle the alphabet soup of XDR, MDR, EDR.
